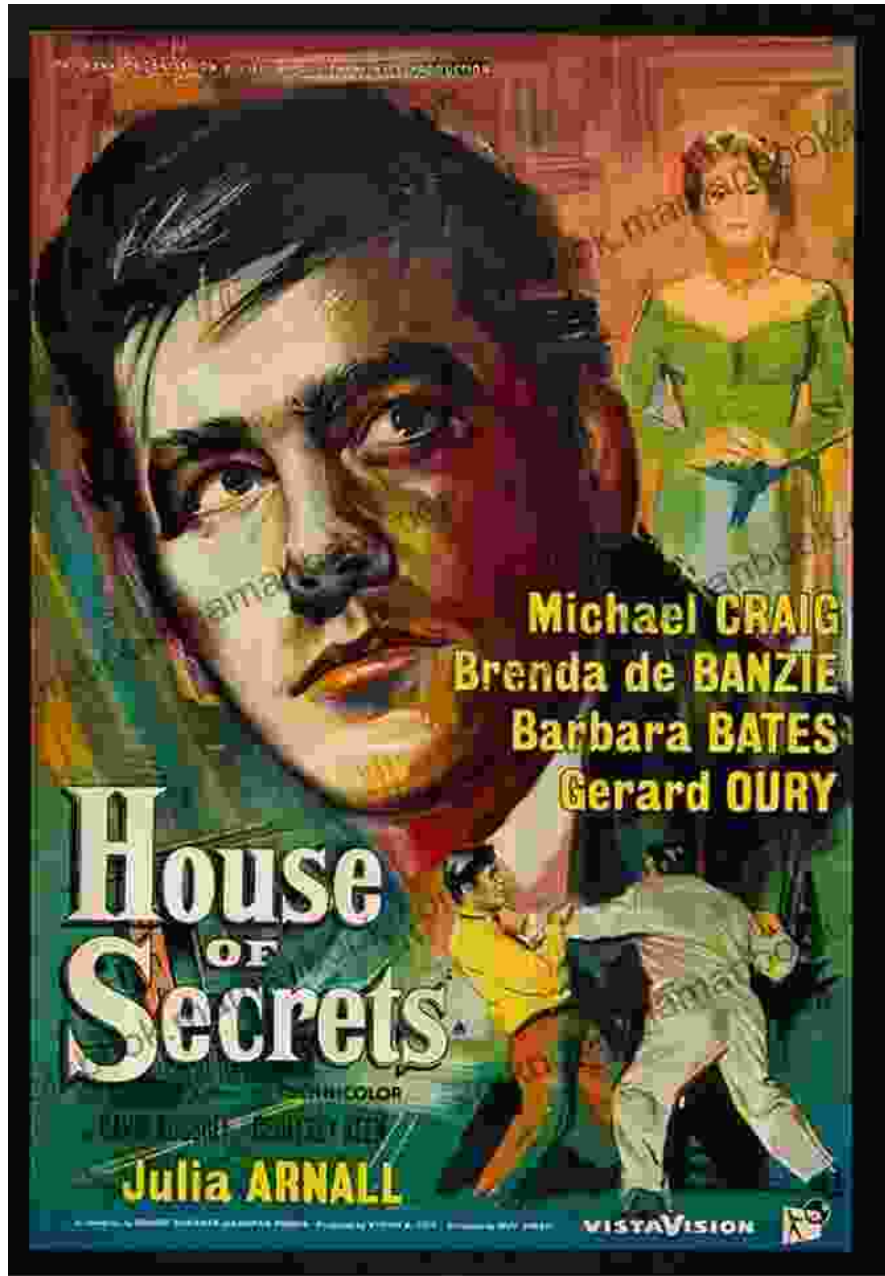


House of Secrets 1956-1978: The Dark and Enigmatic Comic Book Series by DC Comics

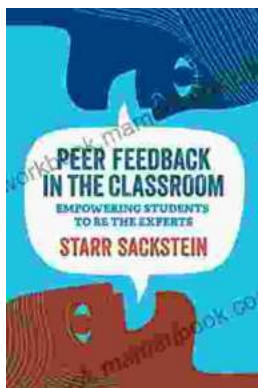
