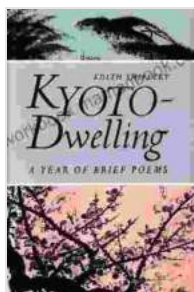


Kyoto Dwelling Poems: A Year of Brief Poems

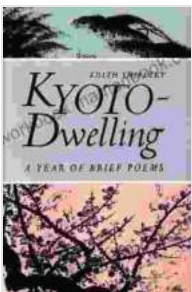

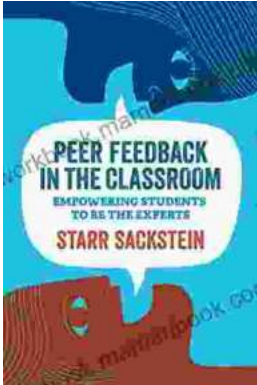
