
Preschool Themed Activities: Chicka Chicka Boom Boom Theme


4. Chicka Chicka Boom Boom Rhyming Game

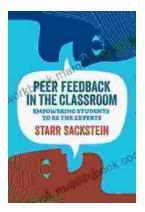


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
